

Assessment Attempts

- One assessment includes five attempts.
- Adaptive assessment with up to thirty questions—314 topics in 30 questions or less.
- Assessment begins with Intermediate Algebra and adapts subsequent questions based on student response.
- All questions are open response—no multiple choice options.
- Students will have twelve months access from the date of their first attempt. No cost for additional attempts.

ADA and Accessibility

- There is no time limit for a student taking the ALEKS assessment.
- ALEKS is compatible for use with *JAWS* or *Read, Write, Gold* for students approved to have the assessment read to them.

Prep and Learning Modules

- Seamless transition from assessment to individualized Prep and Learning Modules.
- Student must complete five hours of Prep and Learning Modules before each attempt.
- Online access allows for on/off-campus testing and simple implementation of learning modules

Scores

- If the student has a current Accuplacer score that is higher, that Accuplacer score will be used for SCC course placement. If no current Accuplacer score, the most current ALEKS score will be used.
- If student has already taken the Accuplacer math assessment twice for the 2017 calendar year, they may take ALEKS.
- Scores are valid for two years.

Proctoring

- All ALEKS assessments are proctored, although Prep and Learning Modules can be accessed at any time after the initial assessment.
