

Annual Notice for College Credit Plus

What is College Credit Plus (CCP)?

CCP is Ohio's program in which eligible, "college-ready" students in grades 7-12 can earn college credits while in middle/high school.

Participation:

Students interested in taking college credit-bearing courses must be "college ready" (as defined by the Ohio Department of Higher Education). Each participating college or university will have their own requirements for determining college readiness and making admissions decisions. There are a variety of ways that a student can participate in a CCP course. Students may enroll in traditional (face-to-face) courses offered at a participating college or university; students can take college courses online; students can participate in for-college-credit courses taught at their high school, or a student may participate in any combination of the previous options.

C-M cannot limit a student's participation in CCP to only courses offered within the district. Students may enroll in multiple postsecondary institutions and take courses from more than one institution of higher education concurrently. Eligible students should review the courses offered at each college or university in order to be aware of the full listing of course offerings by the institution.

Students can take CCP courses during the fall, spring, and summer semesters. Courses taken over the summer will appear on the transcript for the school year beginning in the fall of that year. Any students who take a summer course and transfer to a new secondary school must notify the institution of higher education and the student's prior and new secondary school of such a transfer.

CCP courses currently available for eligible students hosted at CMHS include:

English Composition I
Pre-Calculus
General Psychology
Physics
Financial Accounting

English Composition II
Calculus
Music Appreciation
Human Anatomy
College Accounting

Students and parents must receive pre-participation advisement regarding CCP benefits and consequences.

Students must submit an "Intent to Participate" form to the school counseling office by April 1, 2018.

According to the Ohio Department of Higher Education:

"Students must submit a written notice of their intent to participate in the upcoming academic year, by April first, in accordance with section 3365.03 of the Revised Code, but may submit the written notice of intent to participate as early as February fifteenth. Students desiring to participate in college credit plus in the summer are strongly encouraged to submit letters of intent and begin the admissions process starting in February and prior to the April first notice of intent deadline in order to improve chance of meeting summer registration timelines."

Costs:

Students who are enrolled at C-M who are eligible and take CCP courses through a public university or college will do so at no cost, including tuition and books. C-M is not responsible to pay for any transportation costs to or from any off-site locations where courses are administered.

There may be a cost to a student who chooses to enroll at a private university/college. This cost may vary from private institution to private institution. Students who are economically disadvantaged cannot be charged, even if attending a private university/college. Funding for students from nonpublic secondary schools may be limited.
